Present: Trustee Booth, Trustee Jakubec, Trustee Harkleroad, Fiscal Officer Patton, Road Superintendent Cadle, Police Chief Frost, Fire Chief McDougal, Zoning Inspector Locke and 81 guests.
RESOLUTION #10-91: Mr.Jakubec moved and Mr.Harkleroad seconded the motion to approve the minutes of the September 29, 2010 Regular Trustee Meeting. Vote was unanimous.
Vouchers and warrants #21330 thru #21369 and EFTs #E02277 thru #E02297 were approved for payment.

CORRESPONDENCE:
An e-mail was sent from Barbara Ross asking if the township would be interested in putting on a seminar for township farms/business about grant money that is available plus a tax credit for solar energy.. She would conduct the seminar at no charge. Would there be any interest?
The trustees did not make a decision.

OLD BUSINESS:

- A letter received from John R. Balog about selling the copy rights of his written history of Jackson Township to the township. He wanted the township to be aware of the resident’s offer of \$5000. The trustees are not interested in the copy rights.
- A copy of a letter received that was sent to the Mahoning County Commissioners from Western Reserve Joint Fire Department, David C. Comstock. The letter urges the rejection of the proposal of Mahoning County Commissioners (Sheriff’s Dept) being responsible for the call taking and/or dispatching services for Mahoning County Fire and law enforcement agencies. The Mahoning County Fire Chief’s Association asked him to write the letter.

NEW BUSINESS:
RESOLUTION #10-92: Mr. Harkleroad moved and Mr. Booth seconded the motion for Cash Summary and Financial Reports for September 2010. Vote was unanimous.

- The trustees set the Halloween Truck or Treat Hours for October 31, 2010 – 5-7pm.
- The trustees haven’t had a reply from the Mahoning County Engineer about the letter they sent regarding Silica Road.

Department Heads:
FIRE:

- Chief McDougal advised that the graphics are on the Emergency Vehicle Truck and it should be in service in 1 week.
- He also asked the people that were present to please support the fire levy that will be on the November ballot.

ROAD:
RESOLUTION #10-93 Mr. Booth moved and Mr. Jakubec seconded the motion to approve Mr. Cadle applying for a Litter Control Grant for 2011. Vote was unanimous.

POLICE:

- Chief Frost gave his report for September 2010.

ZONING:
RESOLUTION #10- 94Mr. Jakubec moved and Mr. Harkleroad seconded them motion for the following property mowing charges of nuisance properties. Parcel #500270065030 for \$125.00, parcel # 500220010000 for \$200.00, parcel # 50029002700 for \$175.00, and parcel #500250021000 for \$175.00. Vote was unanimous.

PUBLIC COMMENT:
Mr. Booth introduced Mr. James Trafficant who talked about the proposed Casino in North Jackson. He read a letter that he has sent to the Mahoning County from the Tribal Associates Group. He also has more info that he will present on Thursday to the Commissioners at their Meeting. He is not at liberty to say what that will be about. The Munsee Delaware Indian Tribe will have to be recognized in Washington First and he talked about not overlooking the revenue and jobs that will be generated in the area. Now we have a lot of people traveling out of the area for gambling. By law the Indians must employ 20% of their people of the 1000 jobs he would expect this to generate. He was asking for local political support for this endeavor. The site that has been acquired in Jackson Township was his second choice. Their was sites in Lordstown that he wanted but that did not work out. Mr. Booth asked what revenue benefit the township would receive. Mr. Trafficant advised that when the time comes to discuss this the trustees would be invited to participate in a meeting with all parties involved. The public asked various questions about what the township will receive. Mr. Trafficant advised that at the time of negotiations they would discuss what the Fire and Police departments in Jackson would receive. When the public was asked about how many people would support this project about a third of the people raised their hands. Some of the objections were based on people moving and living in Jackson Township for its rural area. Mr. Trafficant was asked if the property in Jackson is so valuable why it was only sold for \$1.00. He advised that the property was not only sold for \$1.00 but he is not at liberty to say all particulars involved with the purchase. Mr. Jakubec would like to see development but controlled development.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting adjourned at 8:38pm.
